



**Eka Tkeshelashvili,** is Head of EU Anti-Corruption Initiative – currently EU's largest support programme in the area of anti-corruption in Ukraine aimed at improving the implementation of anti-corruption policy in Ukraine. Tkeshelashvili is a lecturer at Civil and Political School in Kiev, Ukraine and in the Black Sea University in Tbilisi, Georgia. She teaches courses on State Building, Transformational Leadership, European Studies and International Law.



**Richard Giragosian**, is the Founding Director of the Regional Studies Center (RSC), an independent "think tank" located in Yerevan, Armenia and serves as both a Visiting Professor at the College of Europe's Natolin Campus and Senior Expert at Yerevan State University's Centre for European Studies (CES). He is also a contributing analyst for al Jazeera and Oxford Analytica, a UK-based global analysis and advisory firm.



**Zaur Shiriyev**, is Crisis Group's Analyst for South Caucasus. Based in Baku, he produces analyses and reports on security and foreign policy issues, including the protracted conflicts in the South Caucasus region. He focuses in particular on the Nagorno-Karabakh conflict, as well as Azerbaijan's relations with regional actors, including Turkey, Russia and Iran.
